Fire District Begins Paramedic Service

On June 4th, 2005 Central Campbell County Fire District began providing Advanced Life Support (paramedic service) to the citizens of the Fire District, which includes the cities of Cold Spring, Crestview, Highland Heights and the surrounding unincorporated county area including Northern Kentucky University. In addition to providing this life saving service for the citizens, the Fire District has increased the on duty fulltime staffing to 14 fulltime personnel, including the Fire Chief, 12 part time Paramedics, and 37 highly trained and dedicated Volunteer Firefighters and Emergency Medical Technicians.

Good Neighbor Award

The award was instituted last year to acknowledge extraordinary acts of kindness by or for our residents. Guidelines for this award can be obtained from the city office during business hours 9:00-5:00 Monday – Friday. Nominations should be written and presented to the city clerk who will give it to the appropriate committee for review. There is a plaque in the lobby of the city building with the first two recipients of this award on it.

Please Note...

Garbage cans should have lids. Cans should be kept out of sight on the side or back of the house until they are set out for pick-up. Garbage may be put out for pick-up on Monday after noon and need to be removed from the curb by midnight Tuesday. Trash bags are an acceptable container for trash – BUT – if it breaks it is the responsibility of the homeowner to promptly clean up the mess created. Cans with tight fitting lids are highly recommended.

Pets must be on a leash at all times when not on your property. All dogs and cats should have a tag that gives your name and address so that your pet can be returned if lost. Remember to clean up after your pets when walking them in public areas. There is a fine for leaving droppings anywhere in the City including the city parks.

Tax bills are the responsibility of the homeowner. If you have a bank escrow account, it is your responsibility to get the tax bill to your bank for prompt payment.

Trash bills are mailed the end of June- they are due on or before July 31st. Trash bills are delinquent August 1st and a penalty equal to 10% of the entire bill plus 1.5% interest is charged per month until the bill is paid in full.

Meeting Schedules:
